

The Town of Lloyd 2008-2009 (Year 6) Stormwater goals which have been met and continuing goals for 2009-2010 (Year 7)

1. The Highland Central School District partnered with the Town to meet their MS4 6 minimum measure requirements and will allow us to file one annual report. A query was made to DEC in White Plains and Albany to determine if Highland Central School District must file a NOI and obtain a SPDES Permit number.
2. To continue our educational outreach program to contractors an informational handout was developed to advise contractors the Town's and DEC's requirements for proper stormwater runoff control and contact person. This is included in the Building Permit Application package.
3. A letter was developed advising homeowners of their long-term maintenance responsibility, local stormwater control requirements, enforcement, and local contact person. This was the beginning step of our yearly inspection procedure for all post-construction inspections of Stormwater Control Facilities.
4. Detention Ponds and Stormwater facilities on private properties were located, identified by section-block- lot, and mapped by Engineering Intern James Mandola. Maintenance procedures were identified as originally designed per site plan approval and mailed to the parcel owners. An inspection schedule was set up. Only one Order to Remedy was needed to be issued to bring all the facilities into compliance.
5. An Engineering intern will be hired this summer to prepare the Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Manuals for the school buildings, fire departments, recreation fields, Water and Sewer Department, and Buildings and Grounds for Town Hall as well as creating a sketch to go along with each document under the guidance of Bill Rohde, Town Engineer. This intern will also fill our requirements to do a minimum of 20% dry weather screening of our outfalls.
6. Two school presentations were done this year by Shari Riley, one during the summer reading kick-off program and one in response to letters written to the Building Department by a 5th grade class in the Middle School. Bookmarks were handed out to the kids and great discussions ensued.
7. Enforcement issues were handled through our parcel tracking software, Muncity, in the Building Department. Two Order to Remedies were issued. One during the yearly inspection process and one because a developer was not following through on his responsibility to complete the SWPPP requirements.
