Water Department

- 1. River water is making up 90% of daily production, the remaining 10% comes from the wells.
- 2. Production time is varying between 10 & 11 Hrs. per day.
- 3. Again, I am attempting to get a waste hauler to the water plant to clean out the Backwash tank so we can clear the clogged sludge line.

Road Crew

- 1. The Road Crew has been busy with utility mark outs.
- 2. Repaired the blue utility truck, they removed and replaced the rear leaf springs. Estimated savings by doing the job in house = \$800.00 to \$1,000.00
- 3. They have started the valve maintenance program.

Sewer Department

- 1. Daily operations continue as usual.
- 2. Cleaning and maintenance increases significantly in the summer months at the wastewater plant and keeps the crew very busy.
- 3. Ruth Zaccardo started at the wastewater plant on August 1st
- 4. Peak Power is the generator company that we have contracts with for maintenance & repairs on our generators.

Peak Power was on site at the wastewater plant last week to evaluate the failed transfer switch. Also, the technician found an oil leak on the engine. The leak is coming from a crack in the cylinder head.

A. RESOLUTION to install "Children at Play" signs on the end of North Chodikee Lake Rd. per the request of Richard Klotz, Highway Superintendent.

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- **B. RESOLUTION** to sign agreement with Keith Libolt, "Highbridge", for a donation of \$10,000 to the Town to be used for the purpose of constructing and or repairing sidewalks within the Town of Lloyd. The Town hereby agrees to accept said donation so that said funds will be used for the construction and or repair of sidewalks within the Town of Lloyd.
- **C. MOTION** to approve Town of Lloyd Film Permit for High Roller Productions, LLC to film a TV Series, Poker Face, at 5 Felsen Lane, Highland, NY a private residence.
- **D. RESOLUTION WHEREAS** the Town requested proposals to rebuild the front entry of Town Hall and received 2 (two) written proposals, one for \$10,400.00 and one for \$5,700.00 the town awards the project to European Craftsman and Remolding for \$5,700.00.
- **E. RESOLUTION**, **WHEREAS** the town budgeted \$9,000 for UHY to perform the Justice Court Audit and Lloyd Development Corporation Audit, and **WHEREAS** Kendra Minard, Bookkeeper prepared and submitted the Justice Court Audit and Lloyd Development Corporation Audit, saving the Town \$9,000, now **THEREFORE**, the Town authorizes Kendra Minard, Bookkeeper to perform the Justice Court Audit and the Lloyd Development Corporation Audit at an annual salary of \$2,000.00 per year at the recommendation of the Town Board, retroactive and effective immediately, budget supported.
- **F. RESOLUTION, WHEREAS** the town solicitated proposals to select a qualified electrician to splice existing underground power lines and install and connect thirty-seven light heads on new poles on Argent Drive, Sterling Place and Gregory Court, and

WHEREAS 2 (two) proposals were received,

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved the town awards the project to Big Red Electric, LLC in the amount of \$11,100.00

G. RESOLUTION

Authorizing the implementation, and funding in the first instance 100% of the federal-aid and State "Marchiselli" Program-aid eligible costs, of a transportation federal-aid project, and appropriating funds therefore.

WHEREAS, a Project for the Tillson Avenue: Route 9W to Route 44/55 in the Town of Lloyd, Ulster County, PIN 8757.81, identified as PIN 8757.81 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code as amended that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal funds and 20% non-federal funds; and

WHEREAS a resolution adopted by the Town of Lloyd on October 12, 2011 approved and agreed to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of preliminary engineering.

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WHEREAS, it was subsequently found necessary to undertake additional preliminary engineering work not contemplated in the original agreement authorized by the previous Resolution; and

WHEREAS it has been found necessary to increase the federal and non-federal share of costs for the additional preliminary engineering work for the project; and

WHEREAS the Town of Lloyd desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of construction and construction inspection work for the Project or portions thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Lloyd Town Board, duly convened does hereby

RESOLVE, that the Lloyd Town Board hereby approves the above-subject project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the Lloyd Town Board hereby authorizes the Town of Lloyd to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of the additional preliminary engineering, construction, and construction inspection work for the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$6,846,0)01 , (\$7,684,001 minus previous \$838,000) is
hereby appropriated from	[or, appropriated pursuant to
] and ma	de available to cover the cost of participation
in the above phases of the Project; ar	nd it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Lloyd Town Board shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the Town Supervisor thereof, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor of the Town of Lloyd be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or applicable Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the Town of Lloyd with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further

F	RESOLVED, that in addition to the Town Supervisor, the following municipal titles:
	Commissioner of Public Works, Town Engineer, Town Comptroller,
	are also hereby authorized to execute any necessary Agreements of
