B. RESOLUTION TO ENACT LOCAL LAW NO. C-2023

At a meeting of the Town Board, Town of Lloyd, held at the Town Hall, 12 Church Street, Highland, New York, on the 19th day of April, 2023, at 7:00 p.m THE FOLLOWING Resolution was moved by Auchmoody and seconded by Fraino as follows:

WHEREAS, proposed Local Law C-2023, A LOCAL LAW TO REGULATE PARKING IN THE TOWN'S MUNICIPAL PARKING LOTS BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 96-6.2 TO ARTICLE III, "PARKING, STOPPING, STANDING AND TRUCK TRAFFIC" TO CHAPTER 96, "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF LLOYD, was introduced at a meeting of the Town Board held on the 15th day of March, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been held thereon on the 19th day of April, 2023, at 7:00 p.m., at which time all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard thereon; and,

WHEREAS, the within local law is a Type II action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and is exempt from further proceedings under such act.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Board of the Town of Lloyd, that Local Law No. 3-2023 be enacted as in the form attached hereto as Schedule "A" as fully as set forth herein, being

A LOCAL LAW TO REGULATE PARKING IN THE TOWN'S MUNICIPAL PARKING LOTS BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 96-6.2 TO ARTICLE III, "PARKING, STOPPING, STANDING AND TRUCK

TRAFFIC" TO CHAPTER 96, "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF LLOYD.

C. RESOLUTION motion by Fraino, seconded by Auchmoody to promote Paul J. Frasch to Senior Water/Wastewater Maintenance Worker at \$30.18/Hour at the recommendation of Water/Sewer Administrator Adam Litman. Mr. Frasch has been employed by the Town of Lloyd for 20 + years and started with our Water and Sewer Departments July 2014. Since his start here he has trained and work in all three departments, the Road Crew, the Water Department and the Wastewater Plant and Paul continues to cross-train. He possesses a D license for water distribution, a Grade 2 in Wastewater, and a CDL and he is an equipment operator. Paul has worked at the Wastewater plant for 6 + years and is a valued asset to us. This position is a noncompetitive Civil Service position and does not require placement exams and is budget supported by SS-8120.1

OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF LLOYD OBJECTING TO GOVERNOR HOCHUL'S "NEW YORK HOUSING

COMPACT" PROPOSAL

WHEREAS, Governor Hochul's FY 2024 Executive Budget included the "New York Housing Compact;" and

WHEREAS, the "New York Housing Compact" consists of the "New Homes Targets and Fast-Track Approval Act" and the "Transit-Oriented Development Act of 2023"; and

WHEREAS, the Governor claims that the "New Homes Targets and Fast-Track Approval Act" is necessary in order to forestall restrictive land-use practices that inhibit and limit housing development; and

WHEREAS, as proposed, the "New Homes Targets and Fast-Track Approval Act" amends General Municipal Law and overrides the Town of Lloyd land-use regulations as adopted in the Town's Zoning Code and consistent with the Town's Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the "New Homes Targets and Fast-Track Approval Act" requires the Town to meet or exceed a Residential Dwelling Growth Target or enact by local law two of five "preferred actions" in order to be considered in "Safe Harbor" status; and

WHEREAS, all of the Town of Lloyd services; police, volunteer emergency

services, water, sewer, and the school community would be grossly impacted; and **WHEREAS**, all five "preferred actions" require extreme and substantial amendments to the Town of Lloyds local zoning including, but not limited to, no restrictions on minimum lot size, height limits, setbacks, parking and no environmental review, planning board review and aesthetic review; and

WHEREAS, appeals can be brought to a new State Housing Review Board usurping the Home Rule authority of local land-use boards who understand the local community; and

WHEREAS, the "Transit-Oriented Development Act of 2023" would amend Town Law to adopt land-use regulations within three years, for higher-density development in areas located within one-half mile of any publicly accessible areas of an MTA transit station; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's plan would impact residentially zoned neighborhoods (single-family neighborhoods); and

WHEREAS, the new amended Town Law would require the new zoning to be exempt from SEQRA review, which would prohibit the study and evaluation of the existing and proposed road network, impact upon volunteer emergency services, impacts on police department staffing, ability of school districts to absorb new students, traffic impacts, sidewalk connectivity, and all standard evaluation criteria in a generic environmental impact statement; and

WHEREAS, the new amended Town law would prohibit Municipalities from adopting reasonable and appropriate development regulations to ensure the development is compatible with the surrounding uses, such as lot coverage, open space, building height, setbacks, floor area ratios or parking restrictions; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Lloyd has a long history of and consistently demonstrating a commitment to providing a wide variety of housing choice; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Lloyd local zoning code includes a wide variety of housing choice; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the Town of Lloyd have had a voice and

participated in land-use decisions for decades, from the updating of the Town's Comprehensive Plan and the recent Hamlet rezoning, participating in public hearings and volunteering on Town Boards and Committees; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the Town of Lloyd will be disenfranchised from their local elected officials, and local volunteer Boards and render all of the resident's input meaningless; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Lloyd implores the

Legislature to remove the Housing Compact proposal from the FY 2024 Budget, and future budgets, and engage local Governments in dialogue and address our common goals; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Lloyd adamantly opposes the Governor's Housing Compact and urges the State Legislature to preserve and protect Municipal Home Rule and Local Zoning Powers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

F. RESOLUTION motion by Guerriero, seconded by Auchmoody

WHEREAS, the Ulster County Resource Recovery Agency ("UCRRA") seeks a site in Ulster County for the disposal of municipal waste; and

WHEREAS, UCRRA commissioned a study of potential landfill sites which was performed by HydroQuest; and

WHEREAS, the study identified two potential target landfill sites on undeveloped land in the Town of Plattekill, and

WHEREAS, one of the proposed Town of Plattekill sites is in close proximity to Black Creek, which runs in a northerly direction from the Town of Plattekill and through the town of Lloyd and into the Hudson River, which is a source of drinking water for the Town of Lloyd, and

WHEREAS, the Hudson River provides drinking water not only to the Town of Lloyd but to various communities along its shores, and is also vital not only to public health and safety but also is an economic and recreational asset to the entire Mid-Hudson Valley, and

WHEREAS, the unnecessary risk of contamination or disturbance to a waterway which runs through the Town of Lloyd and drains into the Hudson River by a potential landfill site is unreasonable and unacceptable, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Plattekill, which contains both proposed locations for the UCRRA landfill identified in the HydroQuest study, is opposed to both the proposed sites due to the potential adverse effects on the community and

WHEREAS, based on the mapping available through the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation website, it is likely that the Town of Plattekill is one of the areas of Ulster County containing a sizable "Potential Environmental Justice Area Community", a factor which should weigh heavily against siting of a landfill within its boundaries, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Plattekill borders on the Town of Lloyd and

WHEREAS, the Town of Lloyd wishes to put on the record its opposition to the placement of a Landfill on either of the sites identified in the HydroQuest study, and **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS,** that the Town of Lloyd opposes the proposed siting of the UCRRA landfill in the Town of Plattekill due both to the risk to Black Creek and the Hudson River watershed and in support of its neighboring community; and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be forwarded by the Town Clerk to the Hon. Michelle Hinchey, state senator for the 41st District, the Hon. Jonathan G. Jacobson, Assemblyman for the 104th District, the New York State Department of Health, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, the Hon. Jen Metzger, Ulster County Executive, the Ulster County Legislature, Executive Director Greg Ollivier and the Board of Directors of the UCRRA and the Supervisor and Town Board of the Town of Plattekill. **Roll:** Auchmoody, aye; Guerriero, aye; Fraino, aye; Plavchak, aye
