Barton reported the Villages has a conditional approval for Phase A. They had a preconstruction meeting today for the infrastructure.

The entire site has an easement for the town for stormwater.

DOT has issued its permit for sidewalks, light, roadwork, pedestrian infrastructure.

69 North Road; Dawes Septic does not need to go out for a quote as it is only \$250. The other part of the clean up, they will get 3 quotes for.

Stewart has started, they have been issued a sitework permit. Building permit will come at the end of the week.

Councilmember Mazzetti asked if all the parcels were all land locked and then merged

together and why wasn't the piece that the ALF is going on merged in.

Barton stated there is no requirement in the law to merge the properties. The language for the PRRD says that all properties within the PRRD are considered as a single parcel.

Plavchak asked what if someone wanted to purchase the piece that has the ALF.

Barton responded they would have to keep it as an ALF part of the PRRD or come to the town for a zoning change, which would be at the discretion of the town which is true for any of those parcels.

Guerriero asked if the PRRD has access through the back of the property.

Barton responded for emergency use only. Apple Lane will be gated, with a lockbox, for emergency use only.

Report of Town Historian – August 2023

Queries:

- 1) I met with Nichole Nightfall and gave her a lot of documentation on Krum Elbow.
- 2) Cathy Rought requested early photographs of her home at 146 New Paltz Rd. which she recently purchased. There were no photos in the assessor's file. She requested some early photographs of the area that she could enlarge and frame. I found some old maps and photos of trolleys and Mohonk carriages.
- 3) Fred Pizzuto asked for information to create a display for the fog bell at the landing. I gave him copies of the article I wrote about it.
- 4) Kyle Williams, town historian from Shawangunk, requested assistance with his efforts to restore the Civil War Soldier's monument on 9W. I told him it was town property and he would have to present his proposal to the town board before any work could proceed.
- 5) Joe Aiello and his sister, Margaret, are coming to NY and want to visit sites related to the Aiellos. I explained that the tomato factory was torn down. They wanted to come anyway to "get a feel of the place where their ancestors lived. I found their burial place and have some articles to show them when they visit on Sep. 15. Donations:

Parks are still be used for picnicking and parties. Pickleball and basketball are being used. Town Field is lined for soccer, which the school district did. Highland Youth Soccer will be using the field on weekends for games and practice.

Tony Williams, highway is putting in pipe and doing some work along the Rail Trail.

The park is very busy. Youth football starts next week. There are four dates that we will need to use the Highway Department for parking. Highland Hose will make sure there are people to monitor the parking lot.

Tennis Courts are being cleaned and pressure washed. Next year or year after we will need to do some crack repair.

Auchmoody asked if there has been any progress on updating the bathrooms.

Supervisor said, they will check on the grants they applied for.

Rosinski reported that the County planning to go on line with Property Taxes in January and they should be doing their training in September.

Water & Sewer – Adam Litman

Water Department

- 1. In August the department switch for river water to reservoir water to allow for the new connection of the raw line on Tillson Ave. Once the connection was made, we switched back to river water to test the new connection, we then transitioned back to a blend and then back to reservoir water. We will again begin blending soon.
- 2. Production time is averaging 10 & 12 Hrs. per day.
- 3. Patrick Davis started training at the Water Department and is doing well.
- 4. On tonight's agenda Frank Palmateer is retiring on September 16th and coming back as part-time starting October 1, 2023.

Frank has been a longtime employee of the Town and has always contributed 100+% to the Taxpayers, to our department and his work. He will be greatly missed.

2. OLD BUSINESS

A. Pavilion update ~ The Barn Raisers

Michael Cambell and Lisa Peterson introduced their company and excitement of working with the town and look forward to becoming an intricate part of our community.

B. Tillson/Toc update

Supervisor reported there is a lot of activity. There is currently a 30-foot hole where the street used to be.

They are finishing the sidewalks, sewer line transition and piers for the new road.

The plan is still currently to open the roads before winter. If we get a lot of rain, it is going to put it behind schedule.

The State will not allow us to keep 44/55 for the winter.

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. Tower Point – Adam Korsin presented their offer to purchase the lease from Verizon for the Verizon cell tower on the Water Tank. They offered a flat \$275,000 to the town which would replace the current \$1500.00 we get per month.

Sean Murphy and Supervisor agreed there is a risk either way and we find someone that can properly perform a risk assessment.

4. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Mark Reynolds, reporter asked if we have heard anything on the grant for burying the power lines in town.

Supervisor said it is a grant through FEMA and we did hear back, they asked for more information. We currently have another grant request through FEMA for the Generator at the water plant, which we applied for prior to this grant and they had us run a public notice in the newspaper for public comment. So that is encouraging that both grants are moving forward. It is a FEMA process and a long process.

Councilmember Mazzetti said he is hearing that he should have given a written reason as to why he recused himself from the Adaptive Reuse Law.

Discussion on proper procedure when you recuse yourself.

Board and Attorney agreed when recusing yourself, a verbal explanation is ok as it will be reflected in the minutes.

 - WHEREAS, the Owners' attorneys have prepared a stormwater control facility maintenance easement agreement, which has been reviewed by the Town's attorneys, engineers, Building Department and Town Board, and the Town Board wishes to approve said agreement.
